## Curriculum and Learning

# Junior Swimming Lessons

Swimming Lessons will resume for Juniors next Thursday (14th September).

For pupils new to school swimming please be aware:

Pupils should wear appropriate costumes for swimming that conform to safety and teaching requirements.

- · No baggy shorts are allowed to be worn.
- · Bikinis and loose clothing are not permitted

Children with long hair or hair that may impede vision must wear a swimming hat.

Pupils should remove earrings before swimming. (Pupils with newly pierced ears must have an earband to be able to swim until the earrings can be removed).

Goggles may be worn by pupils if they wish. However, please note it is the responsibility of parents to teach their child to put on and take off goggles in a correct and safe fashion.

Pupils should not bring shampoos/body wash/talc etc unless there is a medical reason for their use.

It is fine for pupils with verrucas to swim.
